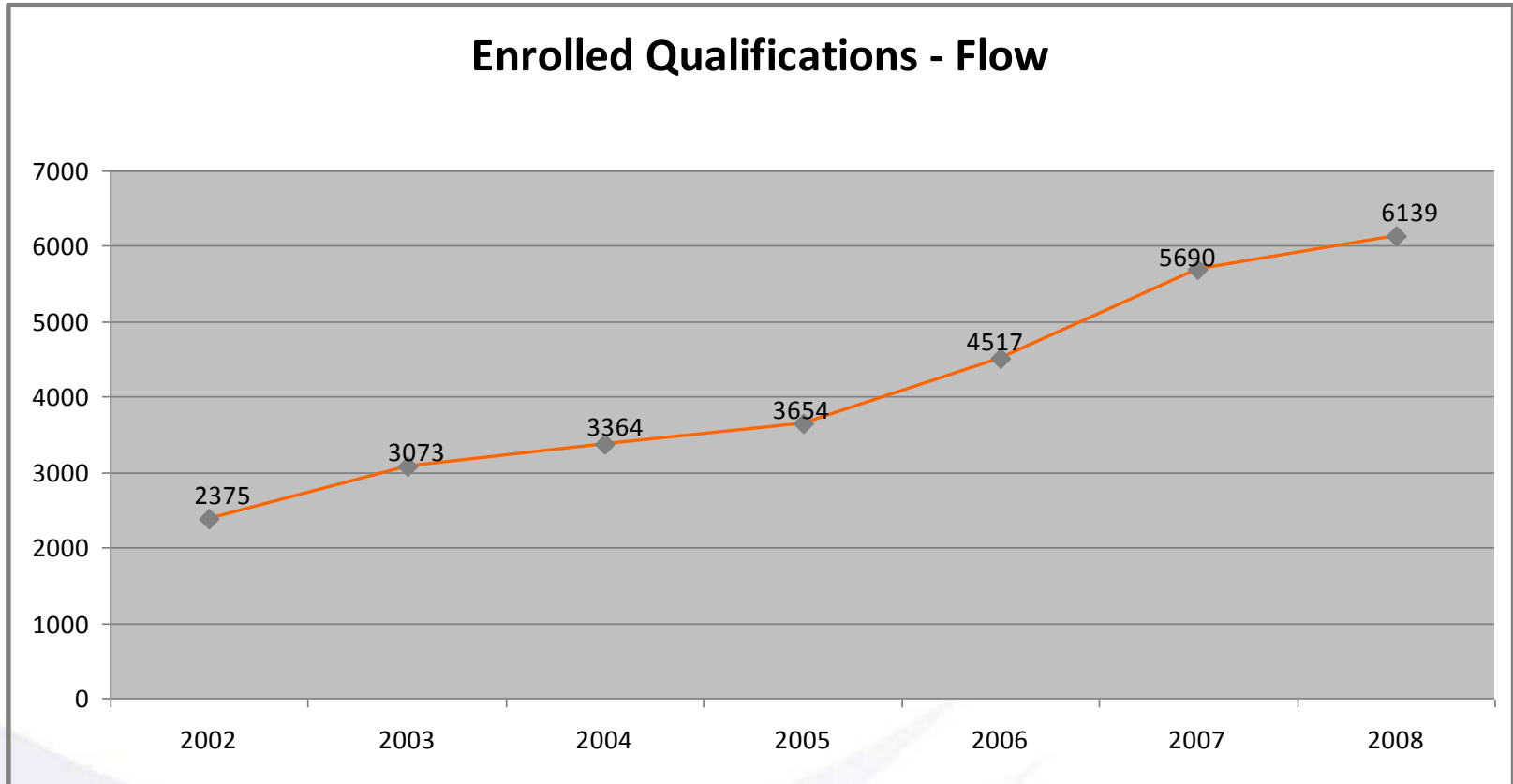


2008 Training Achievements

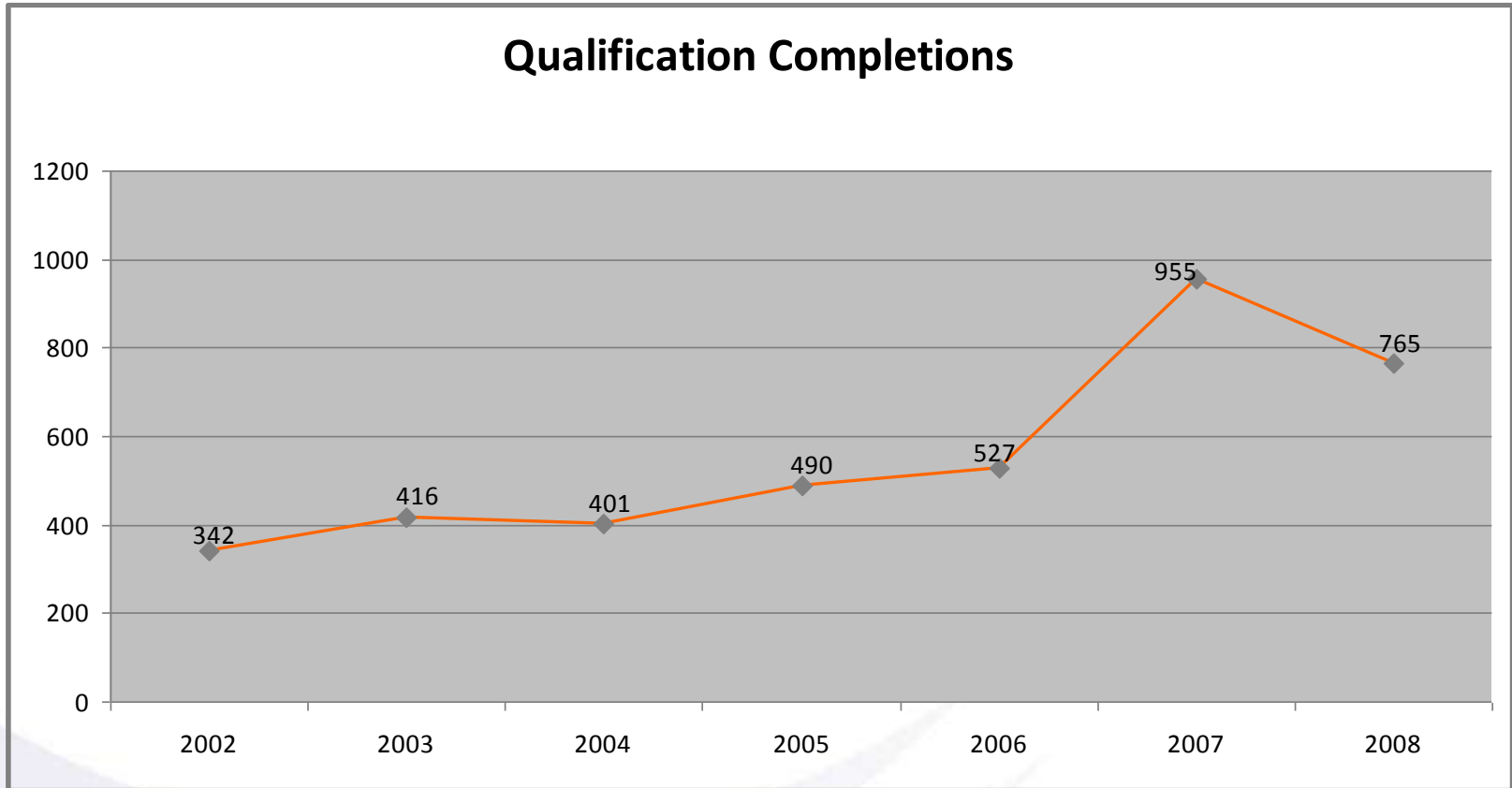
- InfraTrain supported trainees – 6,139

- InfraTrain provided subsidies - \$1,589,565



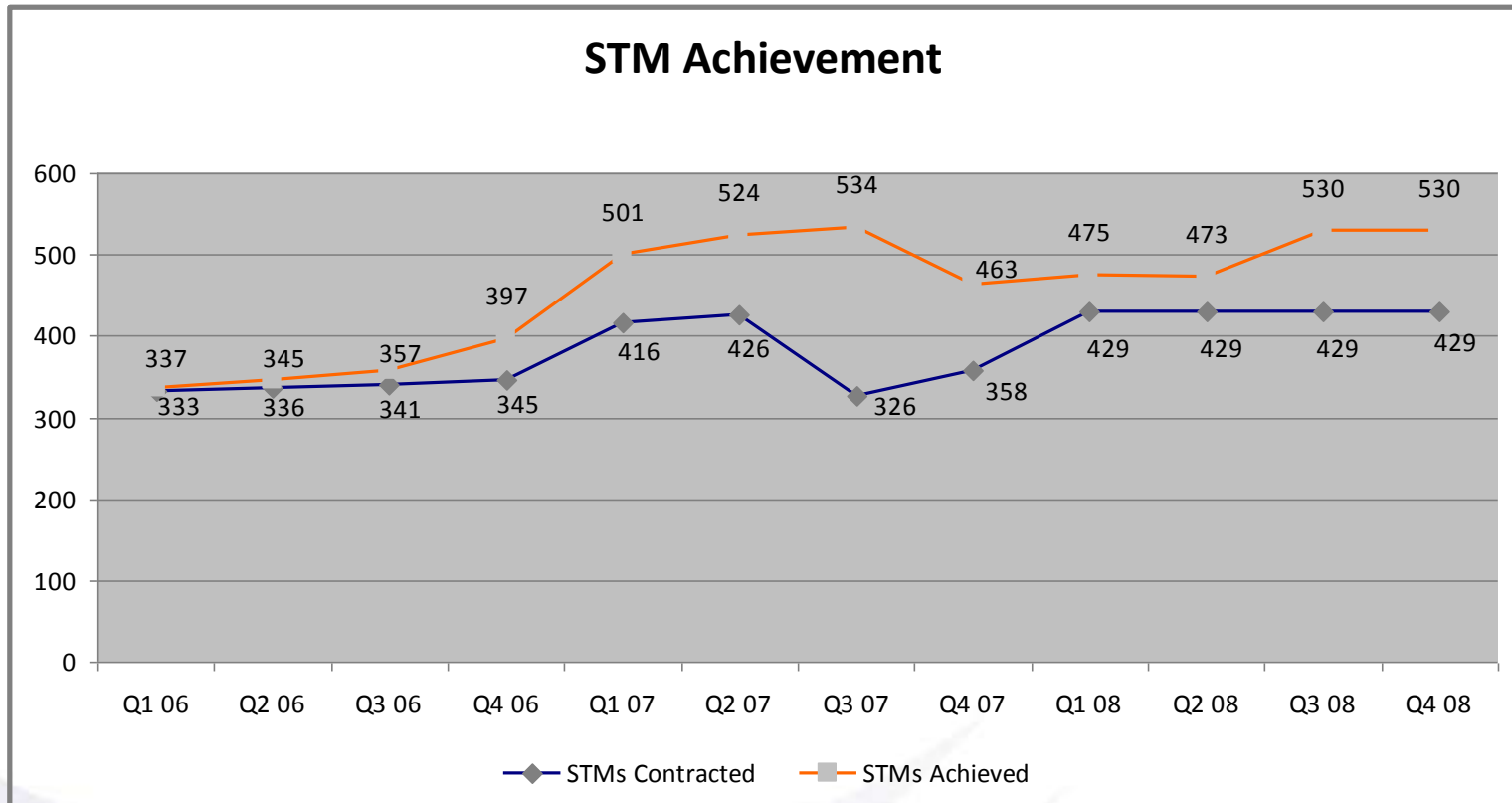
Enrolled Qualifications



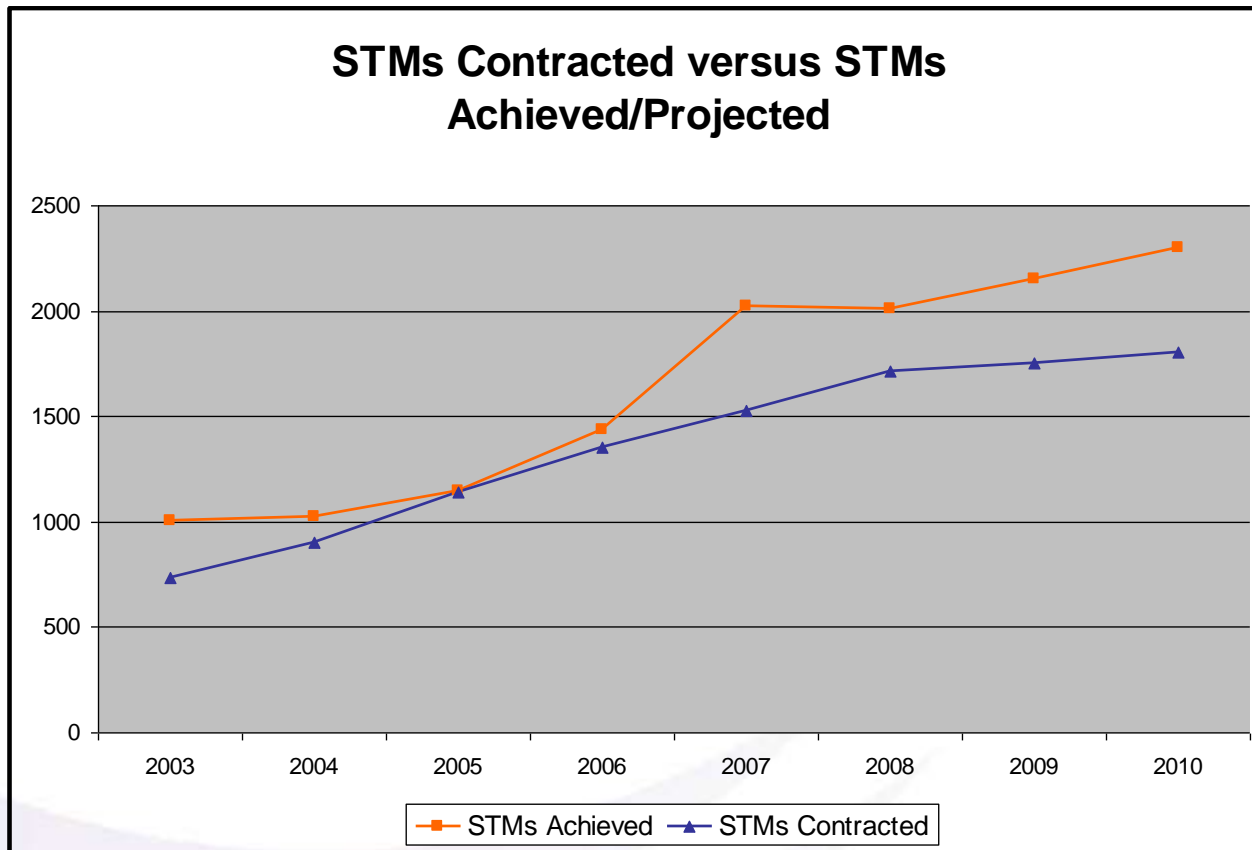
Qualification Completions

New National Certificates covering:

- Assistant L2 or 3
- Operator L3
- Senior Operator L3 or 4

New Roadmarking Qualifications

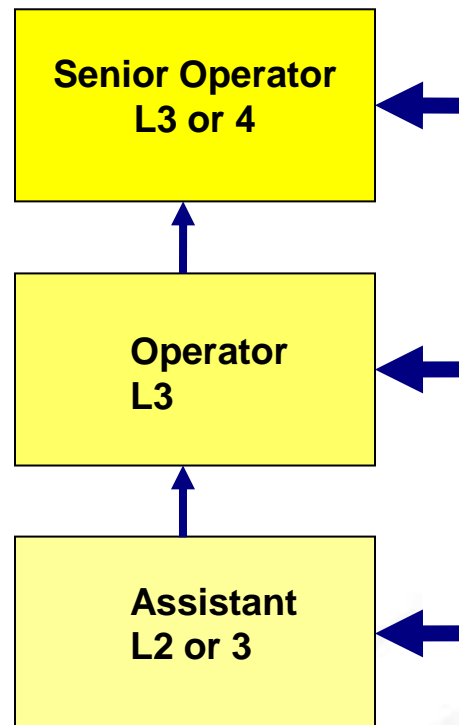
- Incorporate best practice in materials handling, traffic control
- Aligned with traffic management requirements of NZTA and Local Government
- Can be gained on-job
- Qualifications are subsidised

New Roadmarking Qualifications

- Provide choice - flexibility to suit job requirements
 - Core compulsory unit standards
 - Core elective unit standards
 - Optional strands
- Some common unit standards between quals to suit company operations

New Roadmarking Qualifications

Pathway or direct entry:



Assistant Level 2 or 3

- For people working in a support role in a roadmarking crew
- Compulsory unit standards covering:
 - Materials, plant & processes
 - Roadmarking assistant tasks
 - Communication, First Aid
 - H,S & E requirements, HSNO approved handler
 - Class1 with DG endorsement, fire & load loss response
 - TC for Level 1 roads

Assistant Level 2 or 3 (contd)

- Elective unit standards complete qualification – selected from H,S & E units
- In addition, one or more optional strands can be done
 - Piloting
 - Raised markers
 - Thermoplastics
 - Transport

Operator Level 3

- For operators doing remark work with A or B-type applicator
- Compulsory unit standards covering:
 - Roadmarking specs, calculations, records
 - Location, set out & management of simple sites
 - QA & sampling
 - Plant checks & maintenance
 - Class1 with DG endorsement, fire & load loss response, First Aid
 - TC and STMS for Level 1 roads

Operator (contd)

- Elective unit standards selected from wide range of H,S & E units
- Qual completed with strand in either A-type or B-type applicators
- In addition, one or more optional strands can be done
 - Raised Markers, TTM Level 2 & 3 roads, Transport

Senior Operator Level 3 or 4

- For skilled operators doing new or remark work with A or B-type applicator
- Compulsory unit standards covering:
 - Materials, processes & specs for complex work
 - Maps & plans for plant operation
 - Complex set out & calculations
 - Supervision & management of projects
 - Managing H,S & E requirements

Senior Operator (contd)

- Elective unit standards selected from wide range of H,S & E units
- Qual completed with strand in either Long-life Products or Paint Marking
- In addition, one or more optional strands can be done
 - TTM Level 2 & 3 roads
 - Testing NZTA/NZRF T/8 or T/12
